This course will increase your employability, allowing you to work in different sectors of the children's services industry as an educator.

You will gain first-hand experience by completing a minimum of 150 hours of practical placement in the childcare sector. iAscend can help you source this practical placement (but cannot guarantee a placement venue). We recommend that you complete your placement in a number of different settings to gain the maximum amount of experience possible and increase your employability skills.

Qualification Entry Requirements & Pathways

There are no specific entry requirements for this qualification. However you should be able to speak English, read and write English to a level suitable to undertake a Certificate III level qualification and have a desire to work in the Children's Services sector. To work in Early Childhood Education and Care and to conduct your practical placement, you will need a valid First Aid certificate, and may need a Working With Children Check (WWCC). It is your responsibility to obtain your WWCC. On completion of this qualification you may wish to undertake CHC50113 Diploma of early childhood education and care.

Duration, Delivery Method & Attendance

The course is delivered over 26 face-to-face sessions, approx. hours in length, attendance is essential and students are expected to attend at least 80% of all classes. We do not provide distance or full online learning options as we value real face-to-face training methodologies. In addition to face-to-face classes you will be required to undertake self-paced learning each week (2-5 hours) and 150 hours of practical placement, during which your assessor will come out and assess you in the workplace. It is expected that this course may take you between 6 and 24 months to complete. Duration will vary from person to person.

Assessment

A Language Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment must be completed prior to enrolment.
